Mary Catherine "Cay" deVlaming, 41, a devoted wife and mother, died Friday, Jan. 28, 2005.



Cay was a loving wife and devoted mother whose passion for life bubbled into the lives of all her family members and countless friends. Cay's deep-rooted faith blossomed throughout her adult life, particularly growing through her dedication to volunteer work with St. Andrews Social Ministries Program and Meals on Wheels. An active community volunteer, Cay was also very involved with the Van Cliburn Foundation, the U.S. Tennis Association, the Woman's Club of Fort Worth and the Ryan Place Neighborhood Association.

Cay's contagious smile, infectious laughter and positive attitude captured her amazing joy of life that was present every single day. She loved her II-year-old twins with her whole heart, always giving them a wide range of activities and travel experiences. She had an adventuresome spirit and loved her annual journey to Big Bend on her birthday to raft the river and camp under the stars with her three close girlfriends. Many decisions are yet to be made and we need your help and input in those decisions.

Police Chief Mendoza to attend February 21. Chief Mendoza has agreed to come to the Association meeting Feb. 21 and speak with us about the rising crime problem. With him will be the Dep. Chief, Captain of the South Division, Lt. of the Neighborhood Patrol Officers and the two NPOs that patrol Ryan Place. We have seen record numbers of crimes in the last few months.

Please attend the Feb.21 meeting and discuss what the police Department plans to do to combat this problem.

At the January meeting special guests included the Chief Engineer of the Berry/Cleburne Rd. intersection. That location has been modified to reflect driving habits and traffic flow, but also allows for what will be Railroad guard arms to block the tracks for oncoming trains.

More News

The City of Fort Worth has the crossing of the railroad at Capps Street in its sight. This area is part of a quiet zone that hopefully soon will be changed so that less train signals will be heard.

Commercial businesses will be notified by the City soon to insure that litter does not blow from their property into the neighborhood. A gentle reminder will be tried and if that does not get it done, stronger measures will be employed.

CCRP Annual Meeting and Nominations for CCRP Board of Trustees

The CCRP Board of Trustees will hold its Annual General Meeting on Wednesday, March 9, 2004, 1315 Elizabeth Blvd., at 7pm. The purpose of this meeting will be to review the past year's activities of the board and to vote on new Board of Trustee members that have been nominated.

The CCRP By-laws state the qualifications to be a voting CCRP Board of Trustee are:

- (a) A person is eligible for nomination to and service on the Board as a Voting Trustee who:
 - I. has attained the age of 21 years as of the effective date of his/her term:
 - 2. served as a committee chairman during the last year in which a Candlelight Tour was held;
 - resides in Ryan Place Addition as of the date of election of the Trustee.
- (b) Each Trustee shall hold office until the expiration of his/ her term and until a successor shall have been elected and qualified. Voting Trustees shall be limited to two (2) consecutive terms.
- (c) The term of office of a Voting Trustee after the term of the initial board shall be three (3) years.

If you have been a committee chairperson (this also includes residents that have had their home on tour) for and would be interested in being nominated to be a voting Trustee on the CCRP Board of Trustees, or if you know someone that should be nominated the following nomination By-law requirements should be followed:

"Additional names may be placed in nomination by written form signed by 10 volunteers and submitted to the Secretary prior to the deadline set by the Board of Trustees."

The deadline for nominations to be submitted is Friday, February 25, 2004 and needs to be mailed or delivered to Patricia Rodriguez, 253 l S. Adams, Fort Worth, TX 76110. Nominations will be reviewed by the Nomination Committee for qualification and placed on the ballot.

You qualify to attend the General Meeting of volunteers on Wednesday, March 9^{th} and place your vote if you meet the following By-law requirements:

- (a) Volunteers from the previous year's Candlelight Tour, who presently reside in Ryan Place Addition, have attained the age of 18 years, and attend the election meeting shall be entitled to vote in the election of Trustees.
- (b) The Nominating Committee, or its authorized representative, shall determine the eligibility of any volunteer to vote as set out above, and from the list of Volunteers provided by the Volunteer Chairman.

During the Board of Trustees April monthly meeting (April 4th, 7pm, at 1315 Elizabeth Blvd.) the new Board members will be announced. The new Trustees will take their positions on the Board during the April meeting.
