Looking at the statistics that directly affected Us. Mendoza didn't. have a lot to offer except to emphasize the need to know your neighbor and watch out for each other. The Chief said that the Department responds to calls on a priority system and responds on volume of calls. I encourage all residents to immediately call 911 if they see a suspicious person in the neighborhood. Anything that looks strange to you is something you should report. It will also help us keep officers patrolling our streets. Thanks for being a good neighbor.

The traffic and streets committee is making good progress. They briefed the neighbors on their 5 priorities and report success toward their accomplishments. If you would like to be a part of this process please call John Kline or Penny McCook.

Progress is being made on the Neighborhood Directory. Look for ways you can help by volunteering elsewhere in this newsletter.

Neighborhood Finances

Ryan Place Neighborhood does not have mandatory dues. Near the end of last year your street representative should have contacted you regarding our \$25 voluntary annual dues. Since many of those positions were vacant, many dues were not paid. Your leadership and voluntary committees work hard to represent you to the city and before other associations. When information is gathered it is disseminated to you through the newsletter and at the meetings. The neighborhood also owns a very old fire truck that is used in neighborhood celebrations and other city ceremonies. All of this requires funds to operate. Since last years collections were down, I am asking all neighbors to contribute all that they can but at least \$25 help the neighborhood achieve our goals. Soon a neighborhood directory will be published. The fire truck needs heavy maintained and each month the newsletter needs to be published. Without your help none of these things can happen. The Streets/Transportation Committee met on February 20, 2005 and selected the following as work priorities for 2005.)

I.TRAFFIC CALMING DEVICES

- A. James Avenue (Bond issues street)
- B. College Avenue (Bond issues street)
- C. Page Street (In coordination with RR Quiet Zone)
- D. Capps Street (In coordination with RR Quiet Zone)

2. CONTACT TRAFFIC CALMING CONSULTANT

- A. Cantey Street (Over capacity, in middle of neighborhood)
- B. Request City to conduct an O&D study (Original and Destination)

3. STREET MAINTENANCE

A. 35.1% (3 miles) require immediate attention. B. 31.5% (3 miles) require normal maintenance.


4. STREET RECONSTRUCTION

- A. 33.4% (3 miles) require reconstruction.

- B. Develop and maintain a rapport with City officials and staff who have influence on RPIA's street and transportation issues.

5. ESTABLISH FEEDBACK MECHANISM

A. Design an "e-mail" system (or other techniques) to receive in- put from RPIA citizens and to disseminate Streets/Transportation Committee information.

CCRP Annual Meeting and Nominations for CCRP Board of Trustees

The CCRP Board of Trustees will hold its Annual General Meeting on Wednesday, March 9, 2004, 1315 Elizabeth Blvd., at 7pm. The purpose of this meeting will be to review the past year's activities of the board and to vote on new Board of Trustee members that have been nominated.

The CCRP By-laws state the qualifications to be a voting CCRP Board of Trustee are:

- (a) A person is eligible for nomination to and service on the Board as a Voting Trustee who:
 - I. has attained the age of 21 years as of the effective date of his/her term:
 - 2. served as a committee chairman during the last year in which a Candlelight Tour was held;
 - resides in Ryan Place Addition as of the date of election of the Trustee.
- (b) Each Trustee shall hold office until the expiration of his/ her term and until a successor shall have been elected and qualified. Voting Trustees shall be limited to two (2) consecutive terms.
- (c) The term of office of a Voting Trustee after the term of the initial board shall be three (3) years.

If you have been a committee chairperson (this also includes residents that have had their home on tour) for and would be interested in being nominated to be a voting Trustee on the CCRP Board of Trustees, or if you know someone that should be nominated the following nomination By-law requirements should be followed:

"Additional names may be placed in nomination by written form signed by 10 volunteers and submitted to the Secretary prior to the deadline set by the Board of Trustees."

The deadline for nominations to be submitted is Friday, February 25, 2004 and needs to be mailed or delivered to Patricia Rodriguez, 253 l S. Adams, Fort Worth, TX 76 l l 0. Nominations will be reviewed by the Nomination Committee for qualification and placed on the ballot.

You qualify to attend the General Meeting of volunteers on Wednesday, March 9^{th} and place your vote if you meet the following By-law requirements:

- (a) Volunteers from the previous year's Candlelight Tour, who presently reside in Ryan Place Addition, have attained the age of 18 years, and attend the election meeting shall be entitled to vote in the election of Trustees.
- (b) The Nominating Committee, or its authorized representative, shall determine the eligibility of any volunteer to vote as set out above, and from the list of Volunteers provided by the Volunteer Chairman.

During the Board of Trustees April monthly meeting (April 4th, 7pm, at 1315 Elizabeth Blvd.) the new Board members will be announced. The new Trustees will take their positions on the Board during the April meeting.

Clarence Lafayette Marshall 1913 - 2005

Clarence Lafayette Marshall, 90, an owner of Mutual Insurance Agency of Texas, died Saturday, Jan. 10, 2005, at a local hospital. Funeral: Noon, January 15, 2005 in the Drawing Room of Thompson's Harveson & Cole. Burial: Greenwood Memorial Park. Clarence was born Dec. 16, 1913, in Palo Pinto to Guy B. and

Henrietta Marshall. His family moved to Fort Worth when he was 13 years of age. He attended and graduated from Northside High School and then secured employment with Swift & Co., where he was employed on July 30, 1939, the day he married Helen Frances Trent.



He joined Miller Mutual Insurance in the early '40s. He answered the call to serve during World War II, serving in the United

States Army in the Ordnance Department, 28 months of service being in England.

Upon returning, he resumed his insurance career. In the early '70s, he began his own agencies, Mutual Insurance Agency of Texas. Later, he decided to retire and sold his agencies. Finding himself not contented with retired life, he worked with Lay Williams Insurance Agency until his most recent retirement in 2000.

During his tenure at Swift & Co., Clarence sang with Swift's Choral Club. Since 1965, he had been a member of University United Methodist Church, singing tenor with the church choir. He also served as president of the Central Texas Conference of United Methodist Men for four years. His other activities included his membership with the Lions Club and of the United Way Speakers Bureau.

Clarence was a horse lover and raised quarter horses, miniatures and chinchillas. He loved to travel and traveled widely across the United States.

Survivors: Wife of 65 years, Helen Marshall; sister-in-law, Lois Marshall of Azle; niece, Carol Mathis of Azle; and nephew, Eddie Marshall of Azle.


Tony was a loving & devoted husband and family man. He will be missed by many.




