
of Homes, 4th of July Parade, Chili Cookoff, Easter Egg Hunt, Neighborhood Swim, Croquet Tournament, and others.


Don't forget to check out our revamped Ryan Place web site. **www.historicryanplace.org.** (or .com or .net will also work)

Twentieth Anniversary Ryan Place Croquet Tournament Results


Carl and Carl win the Twentieth Anniversary Ryan Place Croquet Tournament





Don't Be in The Dark!

When will my block be getting street lights? Sooner or later if you are willing to put forth a little effort. The Candlelight tour is working diligently to raise money for the streetlights and with matching funds from your block, your street can have lights in the next few months.

The following information explains the "how to's". All your block needs is one or two individuals to help organize your neighbors. We have preprinted letters, other materials and ideas to help get information to your neighbors—we have made it easy! So help enhance your block and improve security—Volunteer to be the one who has seen the light!

A Candlelight Christmas in Ryan Place is a nonprofit neighborhood organization. The current project as directed by our mission statement of Historic Preservation is to raise funds for the purchase and installation of historic streetlights in Ryan Place. These funds have been raised primarily through the annual neighborhood participants who have supported this project. We are especially appreciative of funds donated for honorarium or memorial lights. We will continue to accept these donations. (\$1500 per light)

CCRP in partnership with the City of Fort Worth developed a two-phase plan to implement this mission.

Phase 1: Install lights on Elizabeth Blvd. and at every neighborhood intersection: COMPLETED

Phase 2: a. Install mid-block lights. b. Install lights at alleyways or mid-block on East/West streets
—WORKTO BEGIN IMMEDIATELY.

To expedite Phase 2, CCRP is proposing to establish a matching funds program. With the adoption of this program, new dollars raised for lights by CCRP will go into this matching funds program.


How is this going to work? CCRP will continue to raise funds through the Annual Home Tour. These dollars will provide 50% of the cost of each light. We are asking you and your neighbors to match CCRP's 50% with dollars raised or contributed from your block. Installation will be determined by the order in which each block raises the funds.

Example: 2400 & 2500 block of Willing/ 24 platted lots.

The CCRP/City of Fort Worth Plan calls for 4 lights to be installed on this block at an approximate cost of \$1500 each or a total of \$6,000. CCRP contributes \$3,000 toward the cost and homeowners contribute the remaining \$3,000 (24 potential donors at \$125 each = \$3,000.) These dollars can be contributed outright or creatively raised through bake sales, car washes, or garage sale proceeds.

For the expedition of the Street Light Project, please get involved! Have a block party, make a plan, raise dollars and light the neighborhood!

WE NEED YOUR INPUT!

The Streets Committee needs your input on problems with streets and traffic within Ryan Place.

Please fill out the attached form and mail or email to the committee to insure that your concerns are considered.

Please consider the following when submitting your issues:

- Traffic volume
- Safety issues such as speeding vehicles
- Pedestrian and bicycle access and safety
- Street surface condition
- Curb and gutter condition

Resources from the city to resolve our issues are limited, however, the Streets Committee intends on working with the City to insure improvements are made by taking the following steps:

- 1) Gather the primary areas of concern from Ryan Place residents
- 2) Perform traffic studies where necessary and draft a preliminary problem statement
- 3) Consult with the City's Neighborhood Traffic Mgmt Program, Public Works staff and our city council person to develop potential courses of action
- 4) Review the most feasible alternative actions at a Neighborhood Assn. meeting
- 5) Submit the final proposal to a neighborhood vote by mail. 2/3rds of those who vote must concur for the City to implement a neighborhood traffic plan.
- 6) Gain approval for the agreed upon plan from FW Traffic Engineer and our City Council member.
