CCRP SEEKS DONATIONS FOR STREETLIGHTS

The 15-year charge to get historic streetlights installed throughout Ryan Place could come to a successful end this year if residents pitch in and donate funds to cover half of the cost of the streetlights, which cost \$2,100 each.

Only 118 streetlights remain to be installed out of the total 234 streetlights that were originally planned for the neighborhood, says Steve Clyde, head of the streetlight committee.

All corners in Ryan Place have been adorned with streetlights, which are often referred to as Fifth Avenue-style lights because they were originally installed on Fifth Avenue in the 1920s.

The next phase of the installation will be the "mid-block" lights. Proceeds from the annual Ryan Place Candlelight Christmas tour have paid for 50 mid-block lights. The city will install the 50 mid-block streetlights over the next several

months and will rebate roughly \$500 per light back to RPCC, according to Clyde.

CCRP is turning to residents to match CCRP's \$800 investment for each of the remaining 68 lights. Depending on the number of houses on the block, the donation per house could be as low as \$118.

The decision to ask for donations was driven by the city's budgeting process. "It's important to finish the streetlight installation this year because the city has already allocated funds to install the lights, and we don't want to risk losing that allocation," Clyde explains.

All donations are tax deductible. Moreover, Clyde encourages all Ryan Place residents to see if their employers have charitable matching programs as well.


Watch out for mosquitoes

Controlling mosquitoes and exposure to diseases they might carry can be done by chemical and non-chemical methods.


Your first line of defense begins at home by removing their habitat where they live and breed.

- 2. Eliminate all standing water in rain gutters, old tires, buckets, plastic covers, toys or any other containers where mosquitoes might breed.
- 3. Empty and change the water in bird baths, fountrays at least once a week
- 4. Drain or fill temporary pools of water with dirt.
- 5. Keep swimming pool water treated and circulating.







Making Our Sidewalks Safer

Thousands of purple and blue flags recently were staked along curbs and sidewalks throughout Ryan Place as part of "Safe Sidewalk Saturday," an event held to mark the areas in our neighborhood that are in dire need of repair.

The event prompted city officials to tour Ryan Place and enabled us to demonstrate the need for their help in correcting these problems.

City officials met with Bart Bradford, Dan Roberts and John Kline to discuss potential solutions to the cracked and decaying sidewalks and curbs and the process for initiating the repairs.

The officials felt the areas of primary focus should be 5th and 6th Avenues and Willing Avenue south of Elizabeth

Boulevard. These areas have suffered extensive damage from water leaks.

The city officials encourage us to continue to communicate our neighborhood's needs to the city in a coordinated and organized manner with the help of RPIA president Dan Roberts.

The RPIA Streets and Traffic Committee will provide updates on the progress of sidewalk and curb repair during the monthly RPIA meetings. Although we would all like to see immediate results, please remember this will be a marathon, not a sprint.

The Committee will continue to enlist the assistance of RPIA volunteers with this ongoing initiative.

Twenty-five volunteers demonstrated their support to

help mark the sidewalks and curbs during "Safe Sidewalk Saturday" – the event was truly an RPIA community effort.

In particular, Angela and Cameron Crum deserve special recognition from the neighborhood for their efforts.

The Crums have young children and devoted a tremendous amount of time to this event. Cameron even offered to post the pictures from the event on the RPIA web site.

Bart Bradford also deserves special thanks; he prepared all the coaching materials to help educate our volunteers on which areas needed to be marked with the flags.

Bart spent more than two years surveying and documenting the problems with our sidewalks, streets and curbs.
