FWPD Seeks Participants for Citizens Police Academy Program

The Citizens Police Academy Alumni Association provides an opportunity for residents to help in your community and volunteer inside the Police Department.

Q. What is the Citizens Police Academy Alumni Association (CPAA)?

A. CPAA is a group of citizens who have completed a 12-week course learning more about the Police Department. Some of the courses covered are: the Swat Team, K-9 Team, Narcotics, Gangs,

Traffic, Domestic Violence, Homicide and many more.

Q. What do I have to do to enroll for these classes?

A. Contact your neighborhood police officer (see number at end of story). Fill out the attached application and mail it to:

After a brief back ground check, you are accepted into the Academy.

Q. What do I have to do after I have completed this course to be come an Alumni Member and what does it cost?

A. After you have successfully completed the course you will graduate and be issued

an official CPAA uniform, along with a Certificate and CPAA Badge. You automatically become an Alumni Member. Currently there are no dues required to be an Alumni Member, however this could change in the future.

Q. How much time do I need to

commit to the CPAA?

A. Only the amount of time you want to. Many of the current members are so excited about all the events and meetings that we have that they don't want to miss any of them. We have field trips to many different places such as the "Crime Lab." To further your education about the Police Department, we have specialized law enforcement speakers. We also have community "Good Deed" projects monthly.

RPIA Street & Traffic Committee Update

The Sidewalk Replacement Program is going better than expected. The Street & Traffic Committee delivered a total 57 petitions from Ryan Place residents to the City for participation in the 25% property owner - 75% City cost sharing project.

The following events must take place before sidewalk reconstruction begins:

- All the "letter petitions" will be delivered to the City on or about July 5
- The City will investigate and evaluate each sidewalk
- The City will solicit construction bids. After a successful bidder is selected the city will notify each property owner as to the total price and his/hers 25% share
- The property owner will send a check to the City
- Sidewalk reconstruction will begin.

On June 19, the City told the Street & Traffic Committee:

- The handicap ramp at 6th and Cantey ".... should be repaired soon."
- The City "...shall build/replace as needed" the sidewalks in the vicinity of Daggett Elementary School. (This is consistent with the City's policy to provide sidewalks to service schools.)
- The City is assessing the handicap ramp needs of the RPIA area and the Street & Traffic Committee will "receive a reply once the assessment is complete."
- The reconstruction of James Avenue "should proceed within 1 to 2 months."
- The reconstruction of College Avenue is scheduled for 2008.

RPIA President Dan Roberts asks that every Ryan Place resident send a letter to the Water Department requesting cost participation in the reconstruction of parts of 5th, 6th and Willing Avenues because of the many water main break repairs over the years.

The Street & Traffic Committee also met with Fort Worth South, Inc. to discuss common problems and to initiate a dialogue on building a common effort to improve the neighborhoods.

BACK TO SCHOOL TIP





The best way parents can prepare their children for going back to school is to move bedtime back to "school time" at


least a couple weeks before school starts.

Now that the temperatures outside have soared to the upper 90's, it is an excellent time to pursue "inside" hobbies! For those of you who love jewelry (what woman doesn't!) and would like to make their own unique silver jewelry but don't have any metalsmithing experience, Art Clay Silver is the perfect material.

Art Clay Silver is tiny particles (only about half the diameter of a human hair) of pure silver suspended in an organic binder and water that is modeled exactly like child's modeling clay. After the piece is completed, it is fired (in a kiln, with a torch or with any one of several other commercially available firing devices), burning off all the binder, leaving a pure silver piece of jewelry.

Creating a very special piece of jewelry in Art Clay Silver is simple, fun and fast! You no longer need to spend weeks (or sometimes) months learning complex metal forming techniques since Art Clay Silver is clay, just like the clay you played with as a child, and can be molded, rolled, stamped, extruded, textured – the list of modeling methods is almost endless and is only limited by your imagination!

Each step in the learning process, from a basic appliquéd pendant to intricate filigree, is an exciting, fun adventure with the satisfaction of having a beautiful, new piece of pure silver jewelry in a matter of hours.

Art Clay Silver is very forgiving, and you never need to worry about "wasting" your materials. While the clay is still wet, you can fix your "mistakes" or if you really don't like the piece, just re-roll it and create an entirely different piece! If

the clay has dried, it can be chopped up, re-hydrated with a little water and used just as if it were "fresh out of the package". You can even re-use the fired pieces by cutting them up and adding bits and pieces to add interest to other pieces. And since the fired material is .999% pure silver, it can always be sold to a silver-smith or metals dealer! You just can't lose with Art Clay Silver!

Creating a piece of silver jewelry with traditional metalsmithing techniques can be very costly, requiring expensive tools and equipment, but the tools used with Art Clay Silver are simple, inexpensive and easy to find. Simple manicure implements can be used to form the clay and finish it, a small piece of PVC pipe becomes a "rolling pin", rubber stamps can be used as molds, combs can be used to texture the clay — a quick tour of your own home can result in many unique "tools" that can be used with Art Clay Silver.

Classes at De Platu Pura, beginning with a basic pendant and earrings, and progressing to more complex projects, are each four hours long and are designed to teach the student the basic methods of using Art Clay Silver – rolling, texturing, extruding, molding – as well as more advanced techniques such as incorporating gemstones or glass into the design.

They are conducted in my home, in a casual, relaxed atmosphere and in order to give each participant individual attention, are limited to a maximum of three students. All materials and tools are supplied, as well as snacks and a light lunch.

Streetlight Campaign Update


The response to my letter of appeal has been great to date. During the past two-and-a-half weeks, those return envelopes have brought over \$4,000 into the Streetlight Fund.
