President's Letter

As incoming President of RPIA, I would like to personally thank Dan Roberts for his three years of leadership as the RPIA President. As the new board begins its term, I would like to build on the work of past neighborhood leadership. At the same time, I am hopeful that we will be able to improve neighborhood communications and expand neighborhood events and activities.

The contentious issue surrounding negotiation of an acceptable neighborhood gas lease is now behind us. In addition to addressing safety and neighborhood quality of life issues, the committee negotiated a lease which will provide up to \$50,000 for neighborhood improvements. Now, a decision will need to be made on how best to invest and utilize the money to positively impact the neighborhood for the long term. Moving into 2008, the next major issue that could have a significant impact on our neighborhood is the location of the new commuter rail station. The neighborhood will also need to make a decision on the proposed traffic calming measures for Ryan Place. In 2008, activity will also be heating up around a proposal to have a historical overlay for portions of Ryan Place. Please stay informed on all of these issues by enrolling in the RPIA Discussion forum and by subscribing to our neighborhood e-mail list. More importantly, attend our monthly neighborhood meetings!

Although the major pending decisions and issues facing our neighborhood are important and will involve a lot of work by active neighbors, we still want to have fun! In order to continue fantastic events such as the 4th of July Parade and Fun Run, we need active volunteers. In 2008, my personal goal is to see at least one new and major neighborhood event take place. One idea is to bring back the annual Ryan Place Street Dance.

To meet this goal and to keep the Ryan Place Improvement Association a strong and viable neighborhood association, I strongly encourage you to become involved with the neighborhood. Trust me, you will have a lot of fun and make some great new friends at the same time!!







The drama continues to unfold! The following article, by Bill Conley, was the latest word at press time:

There have been TWO NEW MAJOR EVENTS for all homeowners in Ryan Place concerned about the Gas Oil Lease program.

- (1) The Four Sevens/Chesapeake consortium sent a FedEx envelope to some homeowners changing the terms and conditions from the lease mailed just two weeks ago. The new terms offered to Ryan Place residents, dated October 19, 2007, include the to the neighborhood. following:
- \$12,500 per acre

- 25% Royalty with no deductions except for taxes
- NO surface operations.
- Drill Site: 8th Avenue
- Donation to the neighborhood of \$15,000 / 100 leases

These are significant changes from the lease dated October 5, 2007. This is a generous offer. This is Chesapeake's third lease change

There appear to be no significant changes

7 TRAFFIC CALMING PROJECTS REQUIRE YOUR VOTE















After two years of work with many residents and the City, your RPIA Streets and Traffic Committee presented the Neighborhood Traffic Management Plan (NTMP) at the RPIA October 19 general meeting. The goal of the plan was based on two major citizen's surveyed directions:

- Reduce/eliminate outside cut-through traffic.
- Reduce traffic speed.

A traffic calming plan, approved by the City, resulted. This plan proposes seven improvements:

- Traffic circle at Elizabeth Blvd. and Willing Ave.
- Traffic circle at Elizabeth Blvd. and 5th Ave.
- Traffic divider at Cantey St. and Willing Ave.
- 90 degree intersection at 5th Ave. and Ryan Place Drive (South end of Triangle Park).
- 90 degree intersection at James Ave. and Cleburne Rd.
- Narrowing Jessamine Street with traffic buttons near 8th Ave.
- Narrowing Robert Street with traffic buttons near 8th Ave.

Every Ryan Place property holder will have an opportunity soon to vote on this Traffic Calming package. This is a package deal (all or nothing) and approximately 200 votes are required with approximately 140 favorable votes.

noted to the terms and conditions regarding safety, security and the environment. This is IMPORTANT as these issues are first and foremost in the minds of most homeowners. A more detailed comparison between the two leases will be prepared over the next couple of days.

(2) **The Fort Worth Energy/XTO Energy consortium** offered to the RPIA GO Committee and the President of Ryan Place Improvement Association <u>a new price per acre of \$15,000</u>.

The offer also reinforced the previous terms:

- ♦ 25% Royalty with no deductions except for taxes
- ♦ No surface operations
- ♦ <u>Drill Site: East of Jennings, North of Page</u>
- Donation to the neighborhood of \$15,000 / 100 leases.

All the significant terms and conditions that were important to Ryan Place for safety, security, and the environment were reinforced and are still applicable in the lease offered by Fort Worth Energy/XTO Energy.

The offer also appeared in the October 23rd edition of the Fort Worth Star Telegram. The increased offer has also been made to Berkeley Place and Mistletoe Heights. A detailed comparison between the two new offers will be prepared over the next couple days and delivered by flyer door-to-door.

In a quick analysis, there appears to be a different methodology used in calculating the acreage for the signing bonus. Each company has its own process. Each homeowner MUST look at the bonus dollars per acre, and multiply it times the calculated acreage to make a valid comparison between the two leases.

The safety, security and environmental terms in the Fort Worth Energy/XTO lease still appear to be more favorable for Ryan Place than the Four Seven/Chesapeake lease.

The new Fort Worth Energy/XTO (\$15,000) offer places a 20% premium over the Four Seven/Chesapeake offer, and with the already more favorable terms and conditions for safety, security, and the environment, makes it the preferred lease for Ryan Place. See historicryanplace.org for updates.



For the past four years, I have been sending e-mails with Ryan Place information. The information ranged from lost or found pets to security alerts and RPIA meeting reminders. Earlier this year you were encouraged to register on the Ryan Place discussion forum and you still are encouraged to do so. I have been maintaining the Ryan Place e-mail database, approximately 280 addresses, in case something happens to the discussion forum – it has crashed in the past.

If you have never received an e-mail from me with Ryan Place Information, I do not have your e-mail address. Please send an e-mail to **ryanplaceinfo@yahoo.com** with the subject Ryan Place and your e-mail address in the body of the e-mail to stay informed.



- 1) Park and walk in well-lighted areas.
- When walking in parking lots keep your head up and SCAN the area. If you see something suspicious, walk back to the store.
- 3) When walking to your car with children and packages, have your purse closed and your keys out. Put the kids in first, then the packages, get into the car and lock the doors, then buckle the kids in.
- 4) When unloading packages from your car, be sure to close and lock your car on every trip.
- 5) Avoid walking or jogging alone or after dark.
- 6) If a stranger approaches you, walk toward other people.
- 7) If you are being followed while driving or walking, go to the nearest open public area.
- 8) If a driver stops to ask you for directions, keep more than an arm's distance.
- 9) If your vehicle breaks down, raise your hood and stay in it. If someone offers assistance, open your window enough to ask them to call the Police or a family member. Never get into a stranger's car.

On Saturday, November 17th, you are invited to Cameron and Angela Crum's house at 2611 Ryan Place Avenue between 11:30 and 1:00 to pick up your tree(s) and listen to and learn from Michelle Villafranca, a forester for the City. Michelle will explain how to plant and care for your tree. In the week preceding the tree delivery, she will mark your parkway/curb with flags/paint delineating the location for planting. Remember, they can only be planted in the parkway (area between curb and sidewalk or that general area if no sidewalk). If you paid for the tree(s) to be planted, the tree committee will be e-mailing you with the date of installation. Please keep your tree(s) in a safe place until the contractor arrives to install the tree. Please remember that by ordering and installing these trees, you have agreed to water them for 2 years. Vote Nov. 6 on School Bond Proposals



A FWISD bond program for District-wide classroom improvements, computer technology and other initiatives will go before voters on November 6th. District leaders say it will keep Fort Worth students competitive in a global marketplace.

Proposition 1 of the bond is for \$586.89 million for six new schools and expansions and improvements to existing facilities. Proposition 2, for \$6.7 million, will refinance debt.



New Sidewalks Still Available!

If you are new to Ryan Place, you have probably noticed that some of the sidewalks are brand new, while others are really, really old – and beat up. You may have even heard about a recent opportunity that residents of Ryan Place had to replace their old sidewalks with the help of City funds. The good news you may not know is that the offer is still good! The City's replacement sidewalk program is a 25% owner / 75% City cost sharing. This program is designed to replace deteriorated and unsafe sidewalks; not to add sidewalks where none exist.

If you are interested in participating in the program, the procedure is:

- 1. The home owner submits an application letter to the City (see sample).
 - 2. The City will inspect and evaluate your sidewalk.
- 3. If the City agrees that your sidewalk needs to be replaced, they will send you a letter informing you of your cost. To accept the offer, mail your check to the City.
- 4. The City "bundles" these sidewalk projects and constructs them by groups.


