


won't want to miss this annual event, a time to share lots of good food with friends, family, and neighbors and to catch up on the news before the meeting.



Police Response Praised after an Unusual Home Break-In

Our Ryan Place home in the 2500 Block of 6th Ave. was the site of a home invasion on Friday, January 11th. Since that day we have been struck by the simple fact that we never fully realized that such an alarming event could take place here. We now know that these things can happen anywhere, and we'd like to offer our experience in hopes that similar events can be avoided elsewhere.

My wife arrived home just after 6PM on that day, parked in the drive towards the front of our house, and entered through the front door. She went to the rear of the house where I was preparing dinner. Within a minute we heard a very loud banging noise from the front of the house, a slamming noise that was repeated five or six times. As we rushed towards the front of the house, our door virtually exploded inward and the intruder was suddenly in our living room. He had kicked our door in. My wife raced at the stranger shouting "get out of my house you XXXXX" and thankfully, our visitor turned and fled down 6th Ave. and around the corner on Roberts towards the west.

It was over in a minute, but the impact of this event is still keenly felt in our home today.

A few thoughts about the incident-

The Fort Worth police department response was magnificent.

They were on the scene before we got off of the 911 call. Minutes later a helicopter was overhead scanning with infrared cameras. While no one has yet been found, our police department has managed the situation in a way that assured us that they are committed to our community safety.

The intruder was able to destroy our deadbolt with his kicks. The bolt itself is permanently bent back at a 90-degree angle. This was a powerful person capable of defeating a lock that we had assumed would offer us a high degree of protection. Take a critical look at your doors. Many secure locks are available that could decrease the chances of such an entry.

As always at 6:15 PM, our street had joggers, walkers, dog owners, and kids out and about. We can't give up our freedom of movement of course, but please be vigilant, and never hesitate to call when something or someone looks like a potential threat.

This is not a "Ryan Place problem;" it truly can happen anywhere. We are taking some simple steps here by updating our security hardware and keeping a more vigilant eye on the area around our home. Hopefully this will be a one-time event, but let's all be aware that we can never know when such a situation can occur.



Target: Junk Vehicles

Sec. 22-159. Storing of motor vehicles on public street prohibited

- a) It shall be unlawful for any person to store or allow the storage of a motor vehicle upon the public streets, alleys, sidewalks or parkways of the city.
- b)For purposes of this section, a vehicle shall be considered stored if it has remained parked at or nearly at the same location for a continuous period of time in excess of five (5) days. A stored vehicle is deemed to be a vehicle which is illegally parked on public property, and such vehicle shall be subject to removal and disposal as an abandoned vehicle.

Sec. 22-160. Parking of motor vehicles, trailers, boats and other vehicles in front yards and side yards of areas zoned one-family and two-family.

- a) It shall be illegal for any person to park or to allow to be parked on any property under his control any automobile, bus, truck, motorcycle, motor home, camper, trailer, boat or any vehicle on any portion of a front yard or side yard of any area which is zoned "A" One-Family, "A-R" Residential, "B" Two-Family, "R-1" Residential, or "R-2" Residential under the comprehensive zoning ordinance or on any premises used for one-or two-family, or multi-family dwelling purposes unless:
- 1) Such area is part of a hard-surface driveway or parking area;
- 2) Such area is a part of a gravel driveway bordered by cement curbing or similar permanent border; or
- Such area is a part of a required driveway that provides access to a garage, carport or off street parking area required by the zoning ordinance; or
- 4) Such area is part of a side yard which is enclosed by a screening fence at least six (6) feet in height and so constructed that no person can see through into the area surrounded by the fence.

rounded by the fence.

- b) The term "vehicle" as used herein shall mean every device in, upon, or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a street or highway, except devices moved exclusively by human power.
- c) The term "hard-surfaced" as used herein shall include cement, asphalt, brick and other commonly accepted pavement which may be approved by the building official.

Sec. 22-161. Parking in alley prohibited.

It shall be unlawful for any driver to park a vehicle within an alley.

Join CCRP <u>Now</u> for 25th Anniversary in 2008

The CCRP Board of Trustees will hold its Annual General Meeting on Wednesday, March 12, 2008 at 7 p.m. at 2721 Willing Avenue. The purpose of this meeting will be to review the past year's board activities and to vote on new Board of Trustee members that have been nominated. The CCRP By-laws state that:

- a) A person is eligible for nomination to serve on the Board as a Voting Trustee who:
- 1. Has attained the age of 21 years as of the effective date of his/her term;
- 2. Served as a committee chairman during the last year in which a Candlelight Tour was held;
- 3. Resides in Ryan Place as of the election of the Trustee.
- Each Trustee shall hold office until the expiration of his/her term and until a qualified successor shall have been elected.
 Voting Trustees shall be limited to two consecutive terms.
- The term of office of a Voting Trustee after the term of the initial board shall be three (3) years.

If you have been a committee chairperson (this includes residents who have had their home on tour) and would be interested in being nominated to be a voting Trustee on the CCRP Board of Trustees, or if you know someone who might be nominated, the following By-law requirements should be followed:

"Additional names may be placed in nomination by written form signed by ten volunteers and submitted to the Secretary prior to the deadline set by the Board of Trustees" The deadline for nominations to be submitted is Friday, February 22nd, 2008; they should be mailed or delivered to Mary Edwards, 2835 5th Avenue, Fort Worth, TX 76110. Nominations will be reviewed by the Nominating Committee for qualification and placed on the ballot. You are invited to attend the General Meeting of Volunteers on Wednesday, March 12th and place your vote if you qualify, as follows:

- a) Volunteers from the previous year's Candlelight Tour, who presently reside in Ryan Place Addition, have attained the age of 18 years, and attend the election meeting, shall be entitled to vote in the election of Trustees.
- b) The Nominating Committee or its authorized representative shall determine the eligibility of any volunteer as set out above, and from the list of Volunteers provided by the Volunteer Chairman. New Board members will be announced and take their positions at the meeting on April 7th, 7 p.m., at 2721 Willing Avenue. If you have questions, please contact Sian Borne at 817-923-8683.

Historic Overlay Overview

The RPIA Historic Overlay Committee will introduce the committee's proposed historic overlay document at the February RPIA meeting. The committee's primary objectives in preparing the guidelines were:

- a. Encourage the preservation of homes that contribute to each street's character;
- b. Ensure that any new construction fits not only the neighborhood as a whole, but maintains the distinctive character of each block as well; and,
- c. Eliminate any negative impact to our neighborhood regarding re-development activities.

We believe that our historic guidelines achieve our objectives and ultimately meet our goals of preserving the character of our neighborhood and encouraging restoration without imposing burdensome restrictions on current homeowners. Additionally, the guidelines help to ensure that re-development activities in Ryan Place contribute positively to the character and history of the area.

The City of Fort Worth states, "A historic district in Fort Worth is created through overlay zoning. It is typically a defined area or neighborhood with a common theme based on architectural style, historical development patterns, cultural identity, or social and economic historical patterns. The basic idea behind the creation of a historic district is to preserve the character and identity of an area for the future." We believe Ryan Place not only fits the criteria for designation as a historic district, but indeed will be one of Fort Worth's finest examples.

Remembering Larry Hoskins

Larry Hoskins died suddenly and unexpectedly this past November, 2007. The Hoskins family lived at 1111 Elizabeth Blvd. for many years and were ardent supporters of both RPIA and A Candlelight Christmas in Ryan Place.

Larry was the inspiration for decorating the windows of Ryan Place with candles. Larry designed the "doors" poster for CCRP and, I believe, several others that advertized the annual Christmas Tour; he also gave many hours to the design and restoration of The Gates at Elizabeth, College, and 8th Avenues. As I recall he enlisted a class at Tarrant County College to construct a plywood one-third scale model on the south side at College

Larry deeply appreciated his family, his neighborhood, and all things historical. His architectural talents were used in many homes and public buildings in the area. Each year when the candles light the windows of Ryan Place, the memory of Larry and the Hoskins family will glow in the heart of our neighborhood.
