Spring is finally here and neighbors all over Ryan Place are doing home improvements and sprucing up their yards. Many neighbors also participated in the Ryan Place clean up on May 29th. One of the things that makes Ryan Place so special is the pride our residents take in the neighborhood.

One area that I would personally like to see included in the pride factor is the maintenance of our beautiful streetlights. Over the years, the proceeds from A Candlelight Christmas in Ryan Place and contributions from generous individuals have given Ryan Place the most beautiful neighborhood street lights in Fort Worth.



To keep them beautiful we need to join forces to keep signs from being taped to the poles of the lights. Not only is this activity against City code, but it also damages the light poles. Often, when tape is pulled off of the pole, the paint comes off with it. Take a look at some of the original lights on Elizabeth Boulevard and on other major street corners in Ryan Place to see what this practice has done to the poles.


Let's all join together to stop this unnecessary damage. When you see a sign taped to a light pole, carefully and immediately remove it. Contact the individual who put the sign up and tell them that you have taken their sign down and why.

Many of the signs are posted by people from outside our neighborhood, and I've asked the President of Fairmount Association to join us in this campaign to maintain our street lights. She plans to communicate with Fairmount residents encouraging them to work with us in maintaining the poles in both neighborhoods.

Thanks in advance for your support and diligence in this effort. Have a great Spring and I hope to meet many new neighbors at meetings and monthly social events scheduled over the next few months!

Water Your Trees!

Don't forget to water your trees. It has been an unusually dry spring so far, and the trees that you planted over the winter are about to start their summer growth. Be sure to water them deeply every week, starting now and through the summer if we don't have good rain. In the first year after transplanting, carefully water to avoid letting the roots dry before they are established in the soil. This is crucial to the life of newly planted trees and shrubs.

A WORD TO THE WISE. CAUTION



A Ryan Place resident contacted me to ask if the "annual spree of porch furniture and potted plant thefts" had begun. If you've been a victim of the "spring theft spree," the question makes a lot of sense. I have observed that after the weather gets warmer and before Mother's Day, yard furniture, toys, bicycles, plant pots, or any thing of value that is left outdoors and in sight is at risk for disappearing at night.

Remember to secure patio furniture, place toys out of sight, LOCK your vehicles and take all valuables inside or lock them in the trunk. Leave your home's exterior lights on all night. Patrolling police officers cannot see a thief lurking around your house if its too dark. The cost of a light bulb on all night is certainly less than having to replace valuable belongings.

We all have a lot of power to prevent crime simply by being responsible and careful.

Spring Plant Sale at the Botanic Garden

Saturday, April 19th ONLY, 9 AM to 2 PM

Come to the Botanic Garden's spring plant sale and stock up on plants that thrive in the Fort Worth area. Choose from a wide assortment of trees, shrubs, ornamental grasses, ground covers, perennials, vines, vegetables, and annuals. Specialty plants include lime trees, tropicals, hybrid begonias, and scented geraniums. Rose, African violet, begonia, cactus and succulent, and daylily societies will also be selling their plants. The Wild Bird Center and other vendors will be selling garden-related merchandise as well. Garden staff will be on site to answer your plant questions. BYOW (Bring Your Own Wagon) for loading plants!

An added feature to the sale will be informative talks on the spring migration of monarch butterflies and demonstrations of caterpillar rearing in the gazebo of the nearby Trial Garden. Learn about the Monarch Larva Monitoring Project, a citizen science program. Seeds of milkweed, the monarch's host plant, will be distributed.

LOCATION: "The Grove," the wooded area west of the Trial Garden and the Japanese Garden parking lot.

PARKING: From I-30, take the Montgomery Street exit (#11) and follow the signs on Montgomery to the Linden Street parking lot. Parking is free.





The draft of the Environmental Impact Study for the rail corridor is 98% complete and the printed document should be available by mid-June. The route impacting Ryan Place will be accessed through a contract between the Fort Worth and Western Railroad and the T. Most of the existing track will not accommodate passenger traffic and will be replaced.

Eight Quiet Zones from Biddison to Park Place have been identified. Median barriers 60 to 100 feet long and street closures are the most likely mitigation. Quiet Zones will also eliminate freight horns. Landscaping has not been mentioned, but should be affected by community input.

Base line noise and vibration levels have been determined by monitoring over 24 hour periods. Consultants say vibration should not be an issue and noise impact is from the horns and crossing bells. (I might add that in my home, I hear a great deal of wheel on track noise from the UP line. Replacing track and hopefully, road bed, may be helpful on the FWW line.)

Implementation of Quiet Zones will be in the same 2012-2013 time frame as the opening of the line. I spoke to Russ Wiles (TPW, 817-392-7978) and he indicated that the request for hiring a consultant for the Hemphill/Page Quiet Zone will be going before the City Council this month.

It was reported that there is some effort being made to insert language in the gas well ordinance that will protect the station locations. The language will be something on the order of, "no drilling 300 to 500 feet from where people gather, and 75 feet from the rail bed." Some recommended station locations are already being impacted by this issue.

There will be 22-58 property acquisitions, both residential and business, including those on the TCU Berry preferred alternative site plan.

Daggett, one of the pioneering spirits who was a merchant, legislator, and early promoter of Fort Worth. Ephraim Daggett was inducted into the Texas Trail of Fame in 2006.




