#### **President's Letter**

With spring now here and summer just around the corner, Ryan Place projects and activities are about to spring into action. These events will range from special smaller theme parties and events, such as the Easter Egg Hunt and the Kentucky Derby Mad Hatter Party to major events and activities such as the Memorial Day Weekend Street Dance,  $4^{th}$  of July Parade and the volunteer intensive  $4^{th}$  of July Ryan Run.



This spring and summer we will also have some labor intensive projects as we complete the landscaping, irrigation, and lighting of the remaining Ryan Place gates. Plans are in place to officially "adopt" a portion of Daggett Park as well as Ryan Place (Triangle) Park. Adoption entails RPIA taking responsibility for the bulk of proposed improvements and maintenance to the parks.

We always need neighborhood block captains to help our Street Directors disseminate information to residents. These volunteer roles are also important conduits for getting excellent input and ideas from all the various areas of the neighborhood.

As you know from the March Newsletter, Ryan Place was recently named as the Neighborhood of the Year by the City of Fort Worth and The Fort Worth League of Neighborhoods. This only happened because of the innovative ideas, projects, and neighborhood events and activities that were launched in 2008 and that we are maintaining this year. Without the financial contributions to the Ryan Place Sustaining Membership Program as well as countless volunteer hours we would not have been able to do what we did last year and plan to continue this year. Of equal importance, without the time and energy of countless residents, we would never have been in contention for this prestigious award.

With this in mind, as we move into spring and summer, your volunteer help is needed. Please join your neighbors and give an average of one to two hours per month to Ryan Place. That would be 12-24 hours per year. Imagine what we could accomplish if only 10% of our residents volunteered this amount of time!!

#### **Neighborhood of the Year**

### A Reason to Boast



The City of Fort Worth and League of Neighborhoods have historically selected neighborhood winners in three categories: Spirit, Community Collaboration, and Neighborhood Pride. From the winners of those three categories, a Neighborhood of the Year winner was chosen. This year, making an unexpected change in protocol, Ryan Place was selected as winner of Neighborhood of the Year for 2008 and three other neighborhoods were awarded titles in the three specific categories.

Presently, the City of Fort Worth has submitted a nomination for Ryan Place to Neighborhoods USA in the Social Revitalization/ Neighborliness category. The qualifications for this category were "projects that are initiated by one neighborhood and focus on the social or cultural aspects of a neighborhood . . . that help neighbors feel connected and foster a spirit of cooperation such as neighborhood festivals and celebrations, etc." Specifically, the 2008 Porch Parties were considered such a project. The winners of the national awards will be announced at the annual Neighborhoods USA conference in May.

# Our Trees are Coming!

The free trees from the City of Fort Worth are expected to be delivered on April 3rd and may be picked up starting at 10:00 am on April 4th at John MacFarlane's home at 3017 Willing. The forester has informed us that he is planning for this delivery date; the back-up date is the following week (pick up starting at 10:00 am on April 11th). If your name is on the tree list, you will get an e-mail confirming the delivery date. The City forester will be in the neighborhood beforehand to flag yards for the trees. Be sure to notice the flags if you ordered trees and if you're not happy with the locations, make a note to speak with the forester when you pick up your trees. He will also answer any tree related questions you may have.

Please be aware that:

- -You must plant the trees in the parkway (area between the curb and sidewalk);
- -You must plant trees yourself; and
- -You must water trees on a regular basis for the next two vears.



### Some things change — some don't

Some years ago I returned a piece of litter from our yard to Daggett Middle School. It was a "lost" letter to a parent from the principal. That experience led me to read each scrap of paper I


retrieved from the yard, and as you might expect, I kept the most interesting: a loan offer about late property taxes on a house that now is owned by a bank, a notice of an economic stimulus payment from the IRS, Angelica's Paschal Report Card, John's Record of Discipline Referral (lacking parent's signature), an invitation to a Happy Hour for teachers celebrating the end of TAKS testing for the year, a receipt from the Pizza Hut delivery driver, various notes from/to boyfriends/girlfriends (some well worn like they had been passed back and forth during class). These scraps of people's lives were blown from a recycling cart, thrown from a passing car, or just thoughtlessly dropped on the ground. In an historic neighborhood, whether it is a tree in the parkway, a streetlight, or an historic section of sidewalk, most of us don't throw things away without a sometimes lengthy discussion.

"Throwing away" was exactly what was happening the other day at the corner of Eighth Ave. and Park Place. There is (make that **was**) a section of sidewalk on the east side of Eighth Ave. that laid in front of the 1935-1936 Parkway Theater at the eastern terminus of Park Place. That section of sidewalk had been there for 75 years. It had sparkly flecks embedded in the concrete and was a slightly faded red color. (I don't remember what the theater looked like, but fortunately John Roberts' web resource on Fort Worth Architecture has a photo: <a href="http://www.fortwortharchitecture.com/oldftw/parkwaytheater.jpg">http://www.fortwortharchitecture.com/oldftw/parkwaytheater.jpg</a>)

Why is that theater so historic that I would have found a piece of its old sidewalk of any interest? My mother worked at the theater in the late '30's or early '40's after high school, taking tickets and selling candy. It was one of several neighborhood theaters that were scattered around Fort Worth in the '30's and '40's. Some of them are still standing: The Isis on N. Main, The Berry near the corner of Hemphill and W. Berry, The Rose Theater also on N. Main, and the Ridglea on Camp Bowie, to name a few. Some were lost just within the last several years: The TCU and The Seventh Street. Neighborhood theaters were located near homes during a time when neighborhood retail was within walking distance (or a short ride north of Ryan Place on the Willing/Fairmount or the College Ave. streetcar lines) and the owners of the shops knew their customers names and habits.

Some of that feeling is still around when you and your family visit the same restaurants on Magnolia year after year, when you walk your dog, or accompany your children or grandchildren around the neighborhood. Ryan Place is much more than a collection of houses in a section of streets with arbitrary boundaries on a city planning map. It is a group of neighbors each with their own ideal of what would be the perfect (or near perfect) place to live: a walk-able neighborhood with close-by retail or one with easy access to major streets and regional shopping or the status quo.

Will economics, gasoline prices or the new urbanism movement bring us back to what some remember as simpler times? I doubt it. But we all can cherish the memories, the family stories, or the pieces of broken sidewalk.
