

City Historic Preservation Ordinance Ryan Place Input needed!

The City of Fort Worth's landmark staff is updating the Historic Preservation Ordinance in an effort to streamline the approval process. The draft proposal eliminates redundant text and clarifies confusing language. Among the new proposals are steps to streamline the project review process and revisions to the tax incentives provision. The new tax exemption language will only consider exterior rehabilitation work as eligible for tax relief and excludes any interior project costs, even if it makes the house more livable and sustainable.

A meeting to discuss the updates and receive Fort Worth resident comments was held on September 25, and several RP neighbors attended. Many of the proposals to change the ordinance were favorably received; however, most of the attendees were not in favor of the changes to the tax incentive program. City staff wants to finalize the changes to the ordinance by November, which doesn't give us much time to get the information out or give feedback.

Although Elizabeth Boulevard is the historic district and we have a few scattered single house designations, the changes affect all future historic overlays, designations, or districts. The Ryan Place neighborhood was referred to in the meeting as a "sitting duck" for unprotected historic property damage. We are looking for ways to communicate with the neighborhood about the proposed changes in order to get your feedback to the City. Please take the time to make your voice heard. Look for upcoming public meeting announcements and attend or voice your concerns directly to City staff! If you are not connected to the neighborhood FB page or Constant Contact email blasts, you can always reach out to me directly for more information.



What is Appropriate for Ryan Place

This weekend I attended a fundraiser for the "Twin Sisters Dance Hall" in Blanco, TX. It is 145 years old this year and may be the oldest dance hall in Texas. It has survived as a community center, first for an area of relative sparse population spread over (as the song says) "Miles and Miles of Texas" and second because of its monthly dances in a place where most folks know and look after their neighbors.

Here are two concepts that I think will help our neighborhood survive well past 145 years:

Appropriate In-Fill House Construction – As another house "bites the dust" on Ryan Ave and the threat of TCU housing pressures appear to be more real, let me give my view on in-fill house construction. 1) The new construction should not over shadow its neighbors and it should respect the setback of the other houses on the block face. Nor should it be a copy of another house in the neighborhood. I would prefer it to look like it was built in 2017 than be a copy of the "Ryan" house on Elizabeth or the house next door. 2) Additions to existing houses should be recognizable as additions and not be confused as being built at the same time as the original house.


Doctors, lawyers, accounting clerks, postal workers, educators, nurses and college professors can all live in our neighborhood because of its history of in-fill housing.

Our neighborhood's culture can support street dances, Christmas tours, garage sale weekends, Baseball "Grudge Matches", BBQ & Chili Cook-Offs, Independence Day parades and, yes, even Croquet Tournaments.

Maintaining Neighborhood Traditions – I have often heard it said that "Traditions were easy to start in Ryan Place, but difficult to stop!" Look at our neighborhood's calendar and you will see what I mean. 'Trick Or Treat on Halloween Night' is one of those traditions. The popularity may have begun by enthusiastic decorating, or having whatever. It can be a fun, kid and community friendly activity. Participate if you wish.




