Ryan Place residents,

I wanted to update everyone on a few items concerning events this fall. As we all know, the past year and half has been different for much of the world, Fort Worth, and of course Ryan Place. Before I was President I was the activities coordinator, and I absolutely loved getting everyone together as much as possible. That has changed a lot and we seem to take a few steps forward, then backward and then forward again. With that being said, myself, the CCRP committee, as well as the RPIA board has made the decision to not have the home tour this year. 

It's sometimes hard to find a healthy holiday dessert or treat, but this Pomegranate + Pistachio Dark Chocolate Bark recipe is incredibly easy-to-make, delicious, and healthy! Only four simple ingredients are needed!

INGREDIENTS

300g or 10 oz quality dark chocolate, chopped into small pieces 1/4 tsp Himalayan or sea salt 3/4 cup pomegranate arils (roughly the quantity from 1 pomegranate) 1/2 cup unsalted, shelled pistachios, roughly chopped

INSTRUCTIONS

Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.

Place chocolate in a heat-proof bowl set over a small pot of gently simmering water (make sure water doesn't touch the bottom of the bowl). Stir chocolate until almost fully melted (about 90% melted). Remove from heat and continue to stir until chocolate is fully melted. Add salt and stir to combine. Pour melted chocolate onto the center of the lined baking sheet and spread out into a rectangular shape (roughly 8×10 inches and 1/4 inch thick). It won't fill the whole sheet. Immediately sprinkle over the pomegranate arils and chopped pistachios. Press in gently. Place in the fridge for 30-60 min or until chocolate has hardened. If it is cold out, you can also place it on a covered deck or in the garage to harden. (Alternatively, you can allow it to set at room temperature for 2-4 hours). Break it up or cut into pieces and enjoy!

I can assure you everyone is working hard and we look forward to getting them out in a more timely fashion as soon as possible.

Finally, I would just like to say a few words about the passing of Mariann Taccia. Mariann was a long-time Ryan Place resident and former RPIA president and CCRP committee chair. She moved out of the neighborhood a couple of years ago and sadly passed away at the age of 65 a few weeks ago. When we moved into Ryan Place back in 2006, Kari and I lived fairly anonymously here (which is hard to do!!) and we were getting started with our careers and having kids and so on. In 2011 there was reenactment of the Vin Fiz Flyer (first continental airplane flight) and in 1911 and 2011 the flyer flew over Ryan Place and specifically Triangle park. Mariann created an event to have a chili cookoff and live music that day. Mariann reached out to several people who reached out to me to help set up for that event. It was a blast! A really great time. That was the point that I realized that Ryan Place was so much more than just a collection of homes in a historic neighborhood. The people in Ryan Place are absolutely incredible. Because of Mariann I started to get involved and I am very thankful to her for that.

In closing, we are an all-volunteer board at RPIA. We typically have a full slate of issues to address all the time and it only gets busier as the urban areas and central core neighborhoods like ours are more popular than ever for living and raising families. We are always looking for new people to get involved, to come to board meetings, and be engaged. It doesn't matter your background, what matters is your commitment to your neighborhood and being solutions-oriented when issues arise. Conversations are focused on our neighborhood as well as our surrounding areas (as that affects Ryan Place too!). If you want to get involved, reach out to me or a board member, or just come to a meeting. We meet every third Monday of the month with the exception of July and December.



As always, please bring your own refreshments, blankets, and seats for the movie. We can't wait to see you!


Halloween In Ryan Place
