Finally, it's important to remember that we typically see an uptick in crime during the summer months.



It's "Action" Time in June!

As we enter the final month of the Lights! Cameras! Action! campaign, the RPIA Safety Committee would like to thank everyone who participated in helping support safety awareness throughout the neighborhood, and hope you had some fun with it as well.

June's theme is focused on reminding residents to take action and call 911 to report suspicious behavior. The 911 service is paid for by our tax dollars and FWPD has encouraged us to use this as our first call, instead of posting on social media (that can be done afterwards).

You can also contact our NPO, Officer Garner, after you've reported an emergency.

For true non-emergencies where there is no need for any sort of urgent response, you can call the FWPD non-emergency number at 817-392-4222, and you can always reach out to Officer Garner any time.

As we would all like to see the 911 service improve, it's still the first call you should make to report suspicious circumstances, so don't be shy about using it.

Looking back at May during our "Cameras" month, we wanted to provide a few recommendations from

friends and neighbors on doorbell and camera systems that can help increase security. Camera footage is the number one tool that officers can use to identify offenders and help solve criminal activity.

We've had several members of FWPD praise the number of Ryan Place residents who have security cameras, but they really encourage everyone to jump on board and get cameras installed to help protect your homes and neighbors. While those with home security monitoring can often get camera products through their service provider, here are a few specific recommendations we received:

Affordable: Wyze (www.wyze.com) From single doorbell cameras to whole home security systems, you can build and design your own security system online. Wyze products are well-rated and inexpensive, and they offer professional security monitoring starting at \$9.99 per month.

Mid-Range: Arlo (www.arlo.com) Arlo has a range of products with lots of bells and whistles. Many of the features are well designed in both appearance and functionality, and their app is extremely userfriendly for managing your system from your phone. Arlo is getting



close to releasing their first whole home security system that will be a one-stop shop for cameras, sensors, notifications and professional monitoring services (to compete with ADT, Vivint, etc.).

High-End: Lorex (www.lorex.com) With both home and business options, Lorex provides wireless, wired, and hybrid solutions utilizing on-location DVR's and NVR's with commercial-grade quality and well-performing equipment. There are no monthly monitoring or cloud storage fees, and the products have the latest technology and first-class features, notifications, etc.; however, it cannot be actively monitored by a third-party monitoring system – you have to use a separate service for alarm monitoring.
