The CCRP Committee had a productive meeting in April. The tour homes are about set, several significant sponsors have been secured, and several holiday entertainment attractions have been booked!


This year's tour will be showcasing 5 wonderful old homes whose owners have given them new life! The tour will be held December 3-4, so be sure and save the date!

It's the season for grass and weeds— and they're growing quickly. The city began spot-mowing in January, which is the earliest mowing in recent years. Full mowing of rights-of-way and medians started in February.

This year, rights-of-way are on a 14-day mow cycle during the growing season.

Remember: property owners are responsible for mowing the rights-of-way next to their homes and road. Keep your yard, vacant lot or land cut
